Brainstorming is an activity that most of us think we're very familiar with and know how to do. Perhaps we don't give very much thought to how or why we do it, but we definitely should. At its best, brainstorming can help us to generate innovative ideas at school and at work, but at its worst, it can be a waste of time. If you want the time, you spend brainstorming to be productive, you need to brainstorm effectively.

You may not be aware of the fact that brainstorming, as we know it today, didn't come into existence until 1948. It was based around a military analogy with the idea being that the participants in the brainstorming sessions were storming or attacking a problem in order to solve it. At that time, the rules of brainstorming were that you didn't give other participants any negative feedback on their ideas, instead you tried to build on other people's ideas with your own thoughts. This could be done by giving each person some prompts to help them come up with ideas that they then write down. You could also ask participants to do some word association by giving them a word and asking them to write other words that come to mind when they think of that word, and then other words connected to those words, and so on. If the participants have already focused on the topic and come up with ideas beforehand, these ideas should be more fully formed and useful and less time will be wasted on this initial stage during the group discussion.
